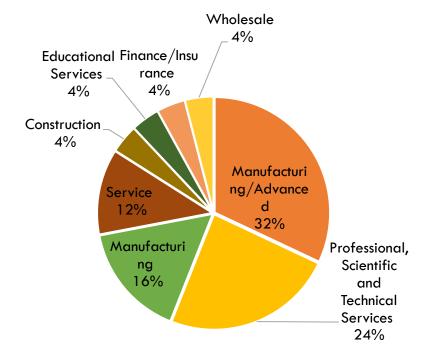

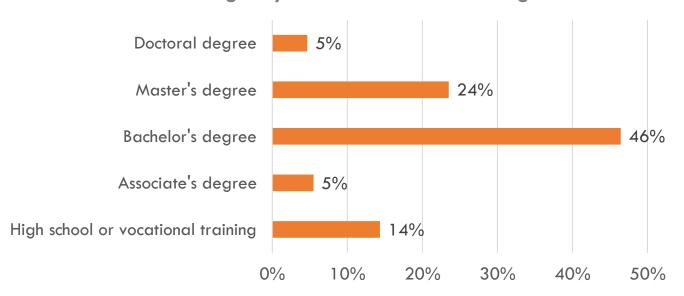

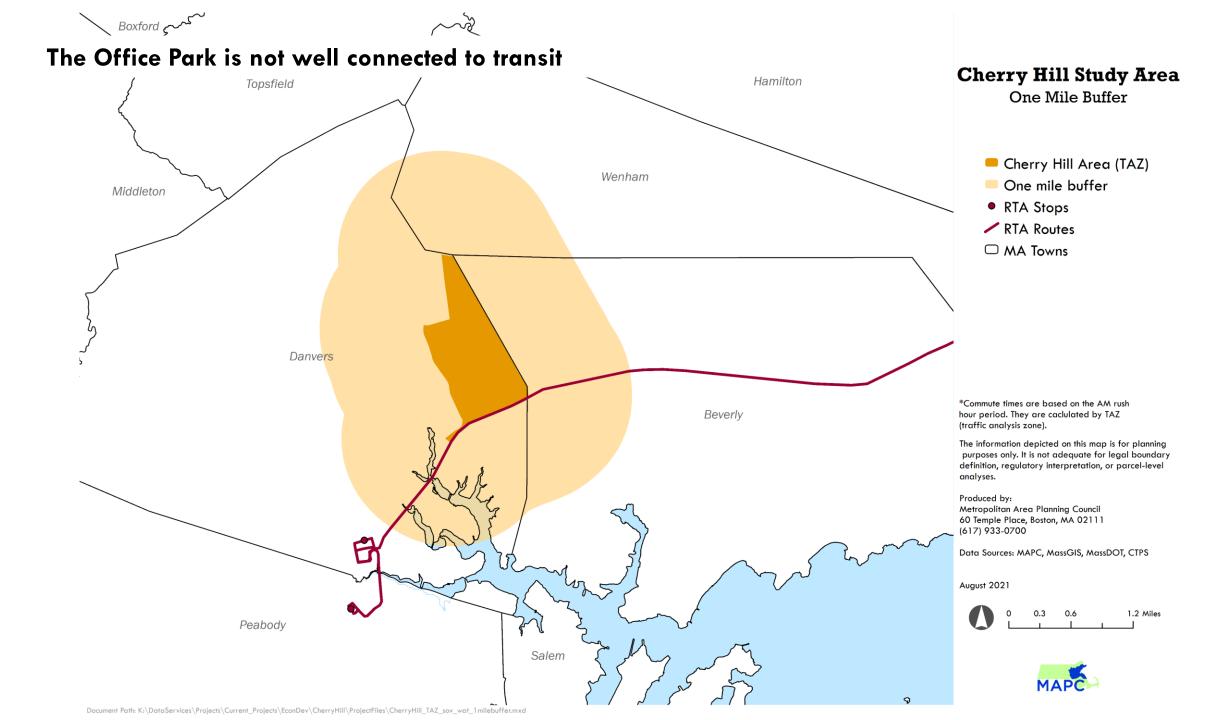

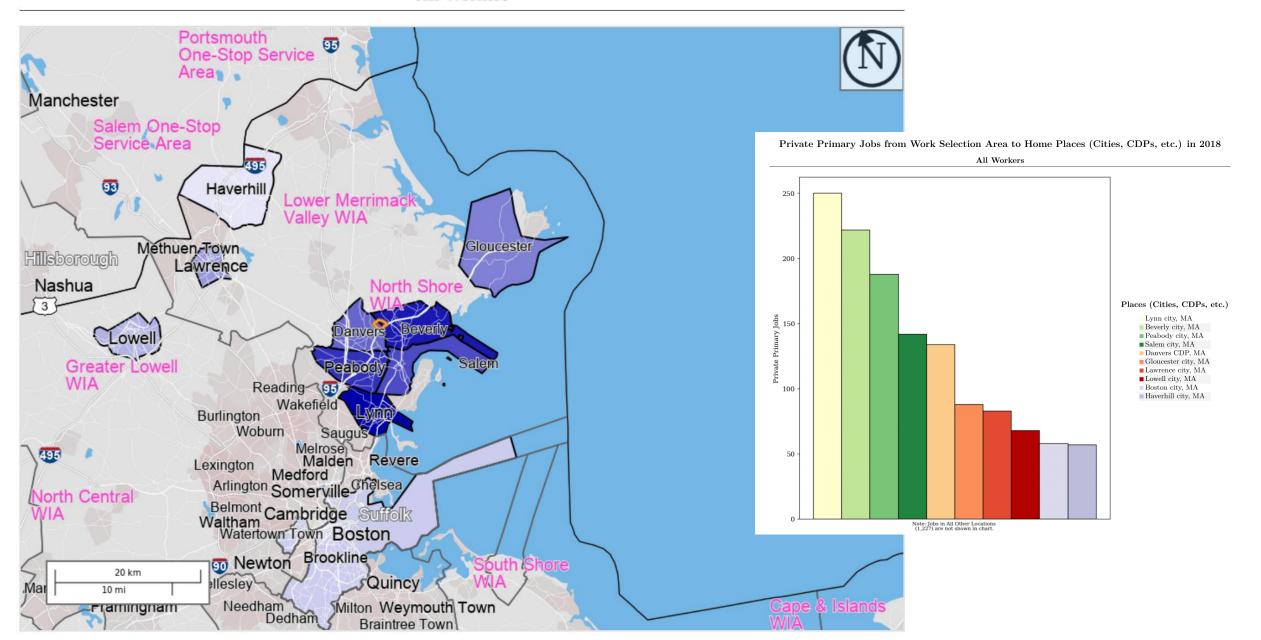

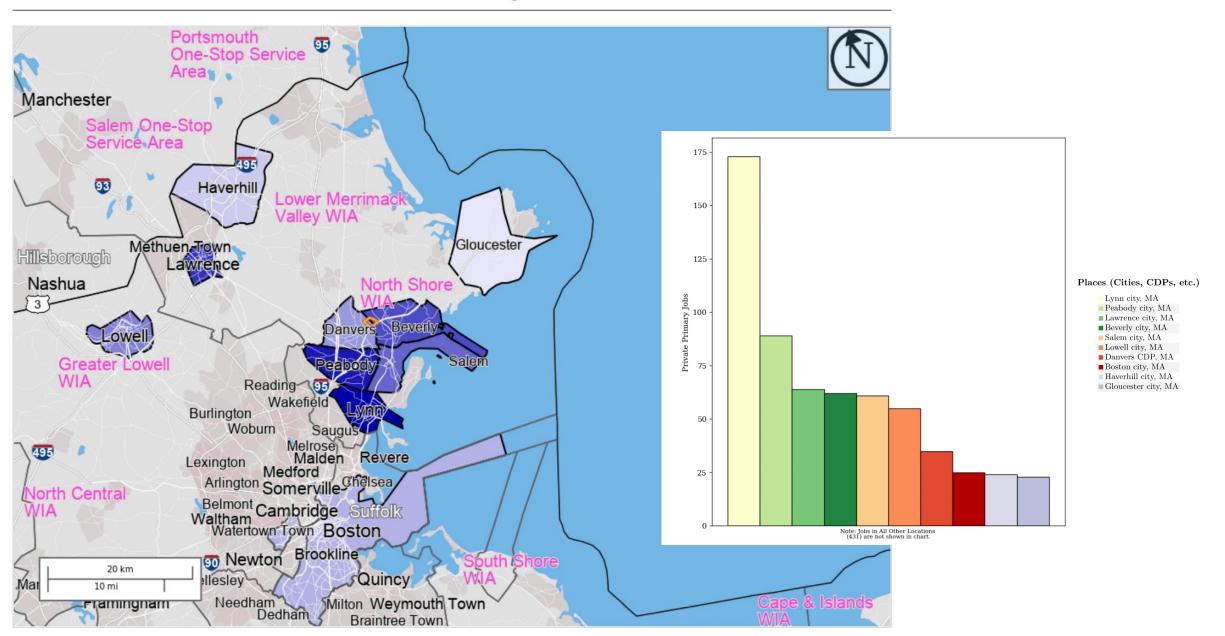
Counts of Private Primary Jobs from Work Selection Area to Home Places (Cities, CDPs, etc.) in 2018

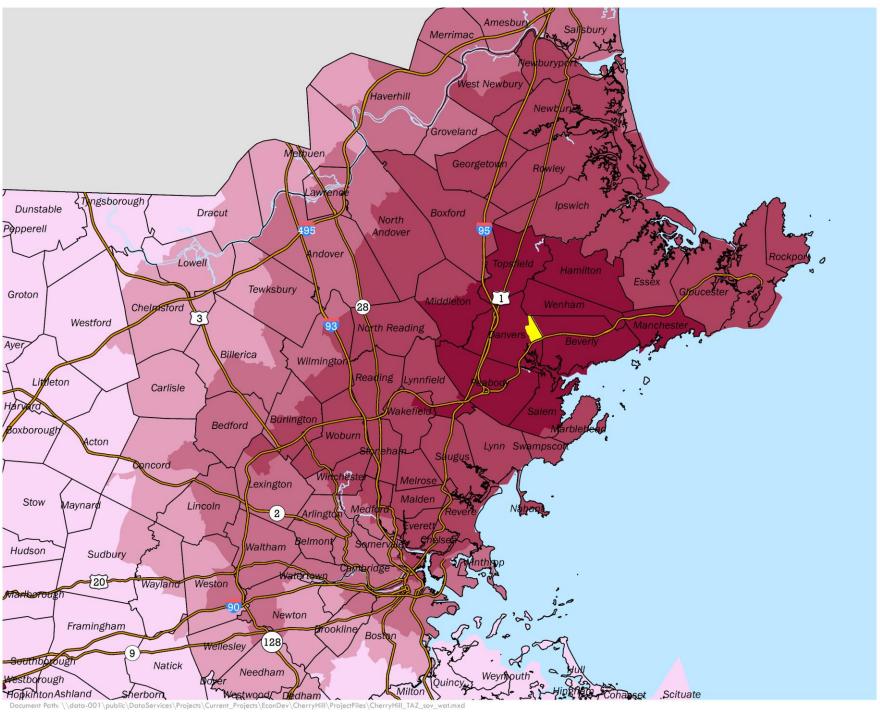

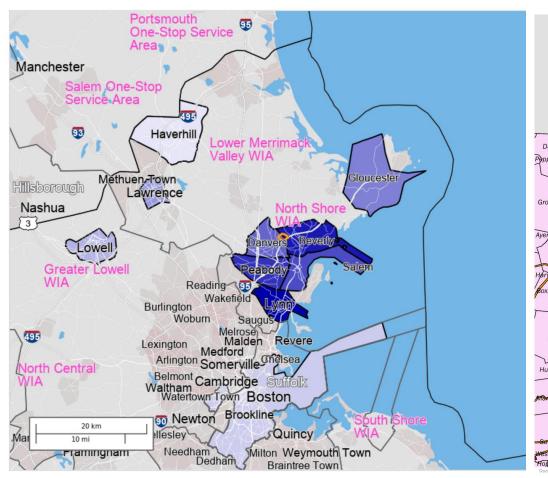

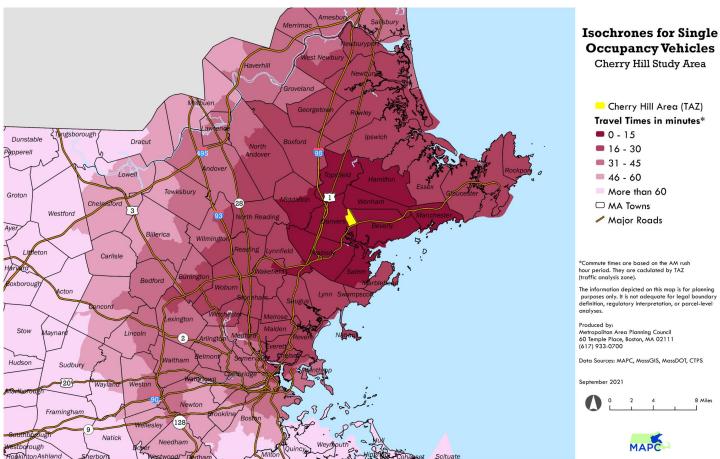
